
1. Situation assessment



- · Animal welfare is the key area requiring improvement and assurance
 - Government is acting on grassland degradation
- · A new Code of Practice is required to suit production systems in China
- Income from cashmere is a small part of goat-related income, so accreditation alone will give limited incentives for improving animal welfare
- Farm documentation is very limited, few auditors familiar with cashmere production
- An effective accreditation programme should support continuous improvement of farm management by herders:
 - improve animal welfare, productivity and profitability through training, extension services and farm infrastructure investment
- Auditing procedures should reduce transaction costs, which are high in sparsely populated pastoral areas

Linking certification and farm support





- Use local vets to document compliance
 provide advice
- → Evidence & improvement
- 100% of herders inspected, sample audited in each programme area
- → Robust & costeffective

- SFA & ICCAW to consult and issue a joint CoP
- SFA & ICCAW to consult with Chinese and international partners
- Develop & deliver training for farmers and farm inspectors
- Pilots informing upscaling
- Draft CoC guidelines to be released soon
