STANDARD DEVELOPMENT

PUBLIC CONSULTATION

The final Public Consultation will be launching soon. Watch this space for further updates.

Why is the standard being reviewed? The SFA first published its codes of practice for rangeland stewardship, animal husbandry, and clean fibre processing with a focus on continuous improvement. Certification could be achieved at three award levels to reflect compliance.

In 2022, the SFA has begun the process of consolidating these three existing codes of practice into a new performance-based, impact-oriented global cashmere standard. The aim is to avoid a proliferation of similar, but slightly differing, SFA codes of practice that were historically produced for specific countries or regions.





NATURAL FIBRE CONNECT VIRTUAL CONFERENCE

This year, the SFA co-hosted the first Natural Fibre Connect conference alongside partners in the wool, alpaca and mohair industries. The event was part of a new collaboration within the natural fibres' sector to highlight the herders' perspective and explore solutions to the industry's most pressing challenges. NATURAL FIBRE CONNECT MONGOLIA CONFERENCE

Last month, the SFA successfully organised the Natural Fibre Connect in-person conference in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia. The event welcomed 120 in-person guests from 17 provinces, and an additional 11 thousand guests who attended via live-steam on the SFA's Mongolia Facebook page. Talks and breakout sessions were held throughout the day with herders and other industry stakeholders to discuss the main challenges facing herding communities and how they can protect their livelihoods while meeting market and sustainability demands. MONGOLIA'S ACADEMY OF SCIENCE PARTNERSHIP

This fall, Mongolia's Academy of Science and the Sustainable Fibre Alliance (SFA) signed a memorandum of cooperation. The goal of the collaboration is to assess and certify sustainable wool and cashmere production operations in order to reduce the negative impact of cashmere production on the environment, provide a better environment for the well-being of herd animals, and increase the ability of herders to recover their livelihoods.

Some of the objectives the partnership will focus on are:

 Jointly developing the methodology of the MLE of SFA according to the International



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Social and Environmental Probability Credentialing and Labeling Standards.

- Developing a three-year data collection strategy, work plan, and budget for the implementation of the MLE methodology in Mongolia.
- Identifying potential data sources at national, regional and local levels to facilitate basic data collection.
- Establishing an interdisciplinary working group consisting of experienced researchers in the 5 main areas of sustainable cashmere production identified by the SFA: animal welfare, biodiversity and land use, herdsmen's working conditions, cashmere quality, and management.
